

JOLLY PHONICS WORKSHOP

We at Ryan, place emphasis on teachers development and growth. As per our Chairman Sir's vision, we continously try to enhance teachers professional development through their constant training. A workshop on Jolly phonics was held at Ryan Global School, Andheri. This workshop was attended by about 200 teachers from all Ryan Schools. It was a great workshop in which expert speaker from abroad Mr. Chris Jollyand Mrs. Shainaaz Jussa had come . Jolly phonics has been developed by Sue Lloyd and Sara Wernham, who were primary/elementary school teachers at Woods Loke Primary School in Lowestoft, England.

The workshop started with few prayer songs which brought in total energy among all teachers present in the auditorium. The guests were introduced and they then took charge of the workshop. Teachers were toldabout the principles of Jolly Phonics, Jolly Grammarand Jolly Music, and how these child-centered, multi-sensory approaches make learning fun and easy for children. The five basic skills for reading and writing were introduced:

1) Learning the sounds

- 2) Learning letter formation
- 3) Blending
- 4) Identifying sounds in words
- 5) Spelling the tricky words

The above topics were introduced with a lot of examples and teachers were all made active participants by creating the 42 sounds of English that were taught during the workshop. Actions for the various sounds were also taught. Basics about grip while holding a pencil were introduced. The concept of Blending - the process of saying the individual sounds in a word and then running them together to make a word, was also told.

At the end of the talk the speaker was facilitated for her motivational talk. Teachers of Ryan Global, Andheri played a game towards the end to thank the speakers through the use of phonics. It was indeed a wonderful workshop with a lot of learning and brushing up of concepts which sure will help in the professional development of teachers



On 5th October 2016, Students of Ryan Global School and Ryan International School Cbse malad and kandivali had an interaction session on education study abroad with Ms. Elizabeth (Bessie) Bennellick, Director of International Programming, California University of Pennsylvania. Every Indian loves their country and are proud of their Nationality.



Global warming and climate change are the terms for the observed century scale rise in the average temperature of the earth climate system and its related effects . Multiple lines of scientific evidences show that the climate system is warming. Although the increase of the near surface atmospheric temperature is the measure of the global warming often reported in the popular press, most of the additional energy stored in the climatic system since 1970 has gone into the oceans. The rest has melted into ice and warmed the continents and atmosphere. Many of the observed changes since the 1950s are unprecedented over tens to thousands of years. Scientific understanding of global warming is increasing. The intergovernmental panel on climatic change reported in 2014 that scientists were more than 95% certain that global warming is mostly being caused by human (anthropogenic) activities, mainly increasing concentration of greenhouse gases such as carbon dioxide. Human made carbon dioxide continues to increase above levels not seen in hundreds of thousands of years. Currently. About half of the carbon dioxide released from the burning of the fossil remains in the atmosphere. We must make efforts to restore our surrounding and protect ourselves from Global warming and Climate change.


THE NASA EXPERIENCE
