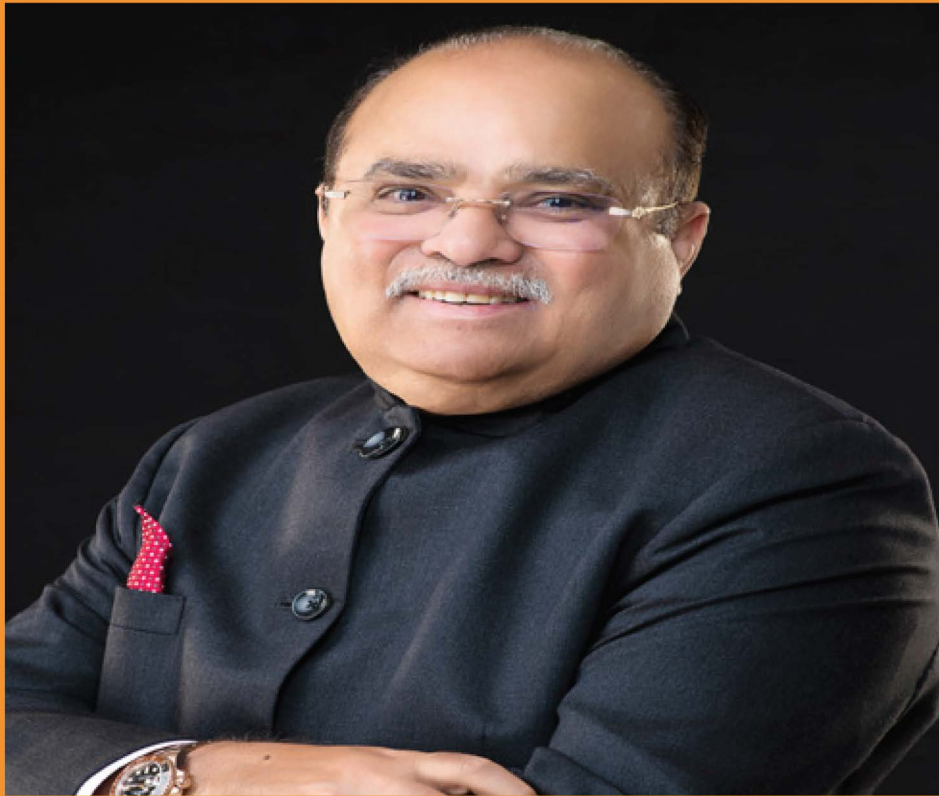

NUCLEAR TECHNOLOGY – HIDDEN WEAPON FOR PROSPERITY

Nuclear energy is the second largest source of low carbon power (30% of the total in 2016). Over 50 countries utilise nuclear energy in about 225 research reactors. In addition to research these reactors are also used for the production of medical and industrial isotopes, it is also used for training purposes. Nuclear energy provides 11% of the world's electricity through 450 power reactors.

Generating energy is not the only use of nuclear technology. In India, using radiation induced mutagenesis technology, The Department of Atomic Energy has developed 42 varieties in oilseeds, pulses, rice and jute which have been released and notified for commercial cultivation across the country. The heat from nuclear reactors can also be used to desalinate seawater whereas the heat from power plants can be used to make hydrogen which can be used to power cars. When burnt it can also generate electricity without any harmful carbon emissions that affect the environment's health.

Radiation is also used in nuclear medicines which allows doctors to make quick diagnosis of a patient's health and cure any ailments. Over 10,000 hospitals all over the grid use radioisotopes in medicine, and about 90% of the procedures are for diagnosis. The KokilabenDhirubhaiAmbani hospital and research institute has the best nuclear department in Mumbai, India which uses state-of-the-art nuclear technology to diagnose and treat their patients. Apart from this, nuclear energy can also be used in space travel. The Radioisotope thermal generators (RTGs) generate heat from the decay of a radioactive source, often plutonium-238 which in return can be used to generate electricity. The latest mars rover, Curiosity uses RTGs for electricity and heat as solar arrays would limit the MSL to operate between 5N° and 20N°.

In my perspective, nuclear energy is not much of an issue unless it is used for purposes to destroy. Nuclear energy can prove to be very useful as it is very efficient and can be used in many different areas of life. As a representative of my country, I would suggest that countries should start inducing methods that would require more usage of nuclear energy and countries should start using this energy in most areas of development.

Facts about Mars

Mars is home to the tallest mountain in the solar system.

Olympus Mons, a shield volcano, is 21km high and 600km in diameter. Despite having formed over billions of years, evidence from volcanic lava flows is so recent many scientists believe it could still be active.

Only 18 missions to Mars have been successful.

As of September 2014 there have been 40 missions to Mars, including orbiters, landers and rovers but not counting flybys.

Mars has the largest dust storms in the solar system.

They can last for months and cover the entire planet. The seasons are extreme because its elliptical (oval-shaped) orbital path around the Sun is more elongated than most other planets in the solar system.

On Mars the Sun appears about half the size as it does on Earth.

At the closest point to the Sun, the Martian southern hemisphere leans towards the Sun, causing a short, intensely hot summer, while the northern hemisphere endures a brief, cold winter. at its farthest point from the Sun, the Martian northern hemisphere leans towards the Sun, causing a long, mild summer, while the southern hemisphere endures a lengthy, cold winter.

Mars takes its name from the Roman god of war.

The ancient Greeks called the planet Ares, after their god of war; the Romans then did likewise, associating the planet's blood-red colour with Mars, their own god of war.

There are signs of liquid water on Mars.

For years Mars has been known to have water in the form of ice. The first signs of trickling water are dark stripes or stains on crater wall and cliffs seen in satellite images.

Life Cycle of Stars

Stars have always fascinated us and people look at them to tell the unseen future, but does anyone know how they are born and the state of their epoch? Interestingly, stars are formed in clouds of gas and dust, known as nebulae. Nuclear fusion of hydrogen at the core of stars provides enough energy to make them shine brightly for many years. This is a delicate balance between gravitational force, which is trying to compress the star and nuclear fusion which tries act as a reaction force to the gravity The exact lifetime of a star depends very much on its size. Very massive stars burn their fuel much faster than smaller stars and may only last a few hundred thousand years. Smaller stars, however, will last for several billion years, because they burn their fuel much more slowly.

Eventually, however, the hydrogen fuel that powers the nuclear reactions within stars will begin to run out, and they will enter the final phases of their lifetime. Over time, they will expand, cool and change colour to become red giants. They start fusing other heavier elements such as helium and carbon. The path they follow beyond that depends on the mass of the star.

Small stars, like the Sun, will undergo a relatively peaceful and beautiful death that sees them pass through a planetary nebula phase to become a white dwarf, this eventually cools down over time leaving a brown dwarf. Massive stars, on the contrary, will experience a lot more of an explosive end, which will see their remains scattered about the cosmos in a gargantuan explosion, called a supernova or if it is big enough; a hypernova. The only thing remaining will be a very dense star known as a neutron stars, these can often be rapidly spinning and are known as pulsars. Neutron stars are formed when the gravity squashes the core of a star so much so that the protons and electrons combine to form just neutrons. If the star which explodes is especially large, the gravity will compress the core so as to convert all matter contained in it, to a black hole.

The trade-offs between plastics and substitutes (or complete bans are therefore complex and could create negative knock-on environmental impacts Strong, lightweight, and mouldable, plastics are used in thousands of products that add comfort, convenience, and safety to our everyday lives. Plastics in carpets, blankets, and pillows keep us comfortable in our homes. Plastics in bottles and coolers allow us to take food and drinks with us anywhere. Plastics in portable electronic devices let us access the Internet or communicate with family and friends on the go. Plastics in sports players' helmets and police officers' bullet-proof vests keep them safe.

Sadly, in 1950 the world produced only 2 million tonnes per year. Since then, annual production has increased nearly 200-fold, reaching 381 million tonnes in 2015. For context, this is roughly equivalent to the mass of two-thirds of the world population. Approximately 70,000 tons of plastic are dumped in the oceans and seas, globally. Discarded fishing nets and other synthetic material are eaten by terrestrial as well as aquatic animals, by mistaking them for jellyfish or food, leading to the bio-accumulation.

28th August 2019

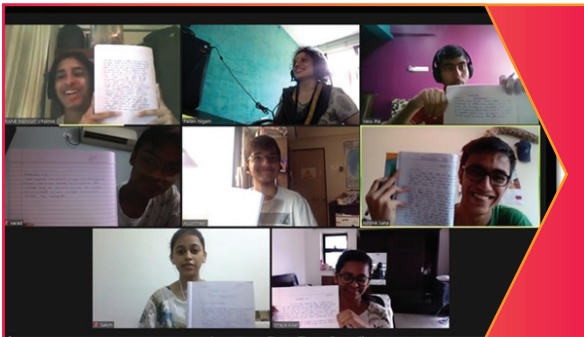

MUSEUM ON WHEELS:

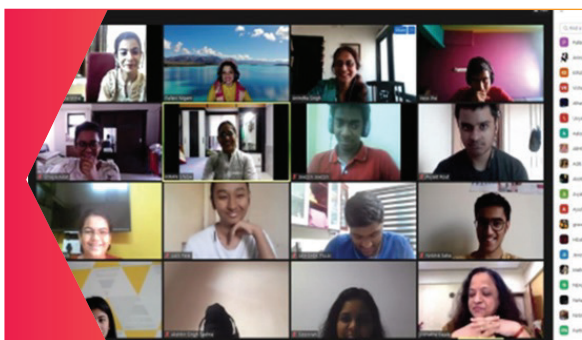
"Fossils: Impressions of the Past"

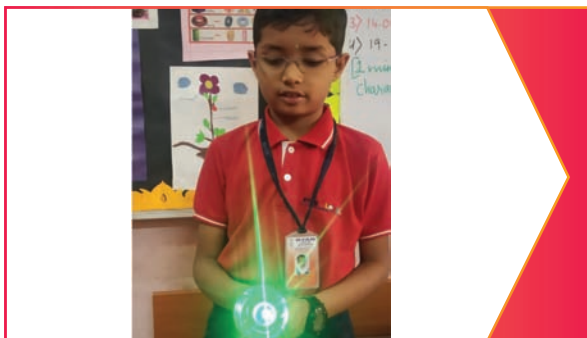
BEST OUT OF WASTE

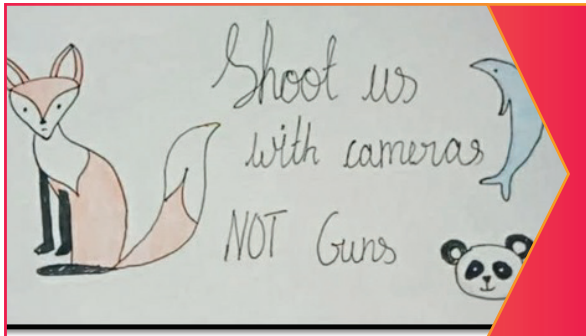
World Environment Day – Poster Making

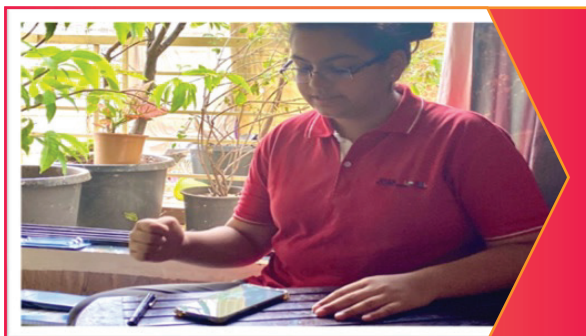
Celebration of Environment Week – Slogan Writing Competition

Podcast on Mother Nature

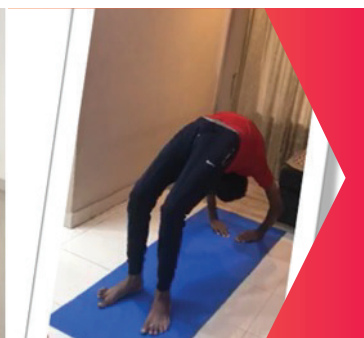
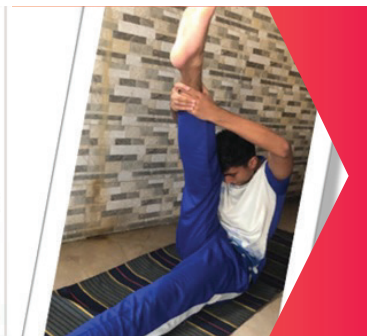

International Yoga Day

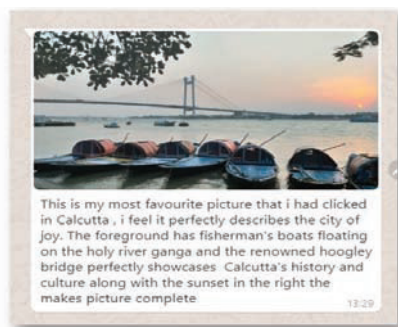

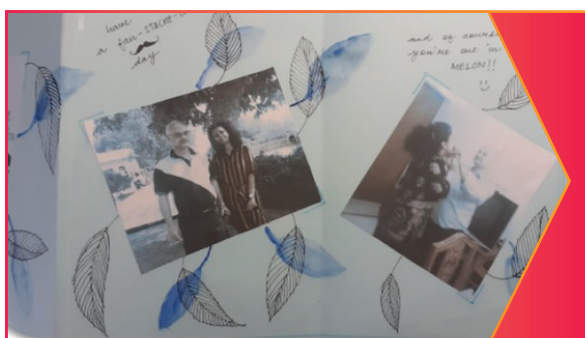
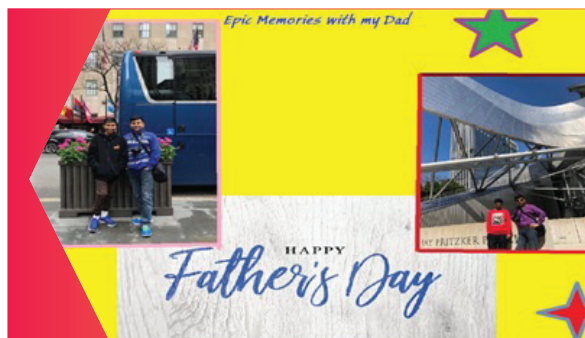


Father's Day Celebration

My Father and Me – Album making Activity

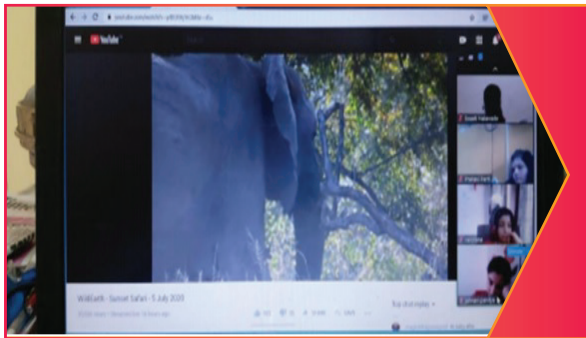

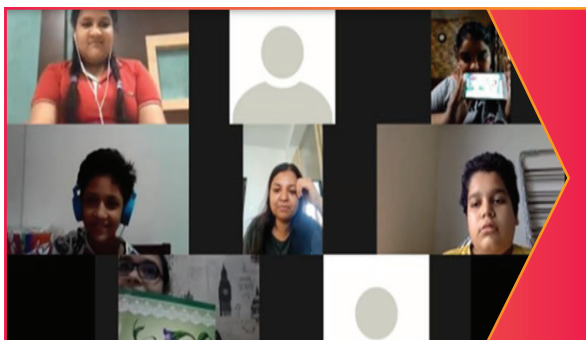
ONLINE SAFARI: VIRTUAL

GROUP SINGING – ON ENVIRONMENT Date: 3rd July 2020

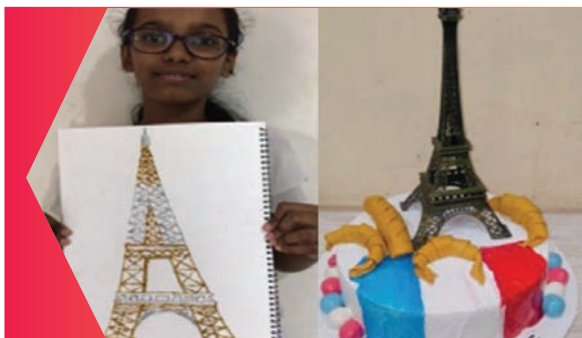

FRENCH DAY CELEBRATION 2020

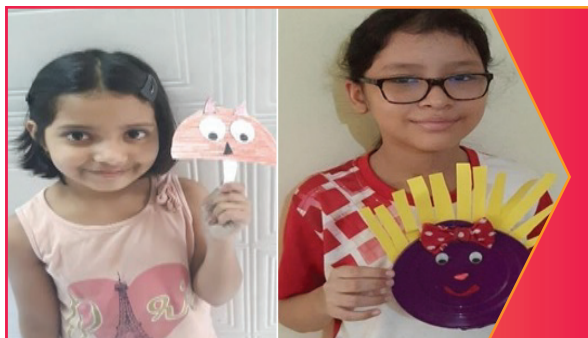
Date: 13th July 2020

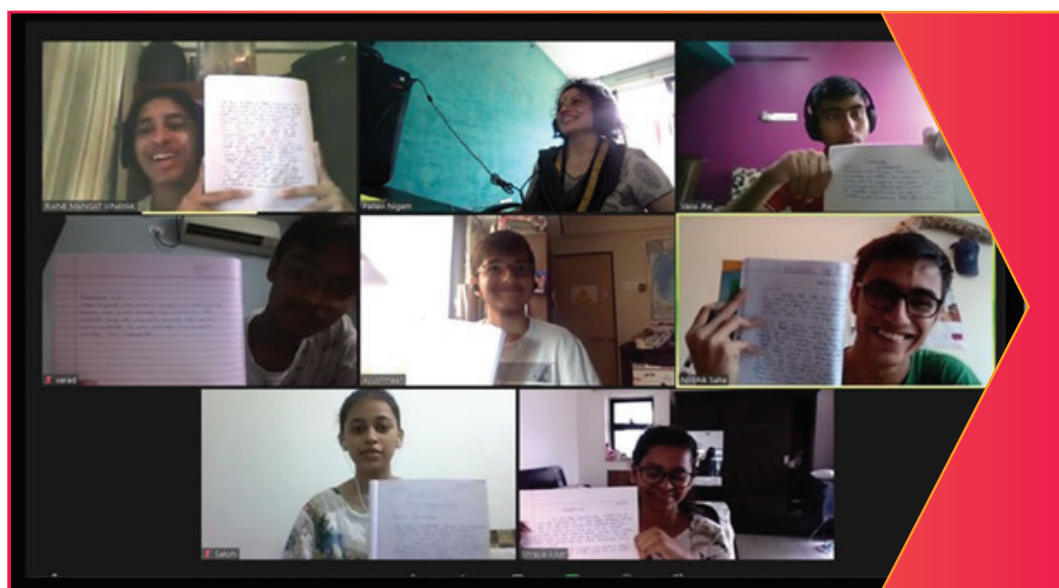

FOUNDERS DAY CELEBRATION

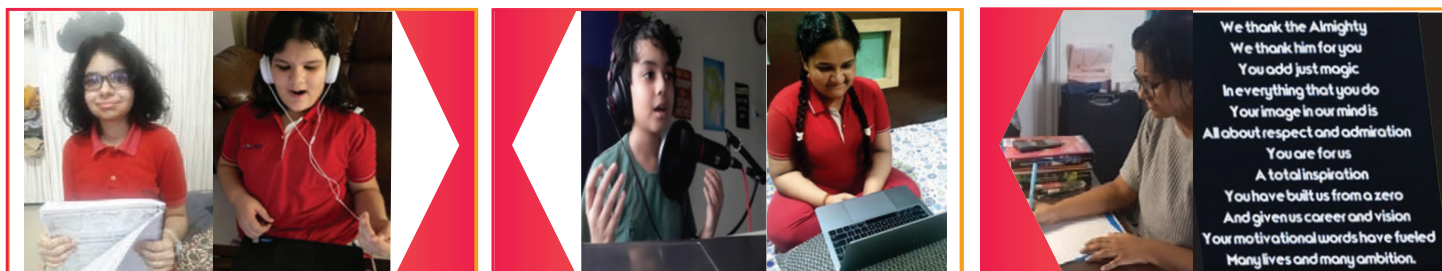

CARD MAKING ACTIVITY AND MESSAGE WRITING ACTIVITY

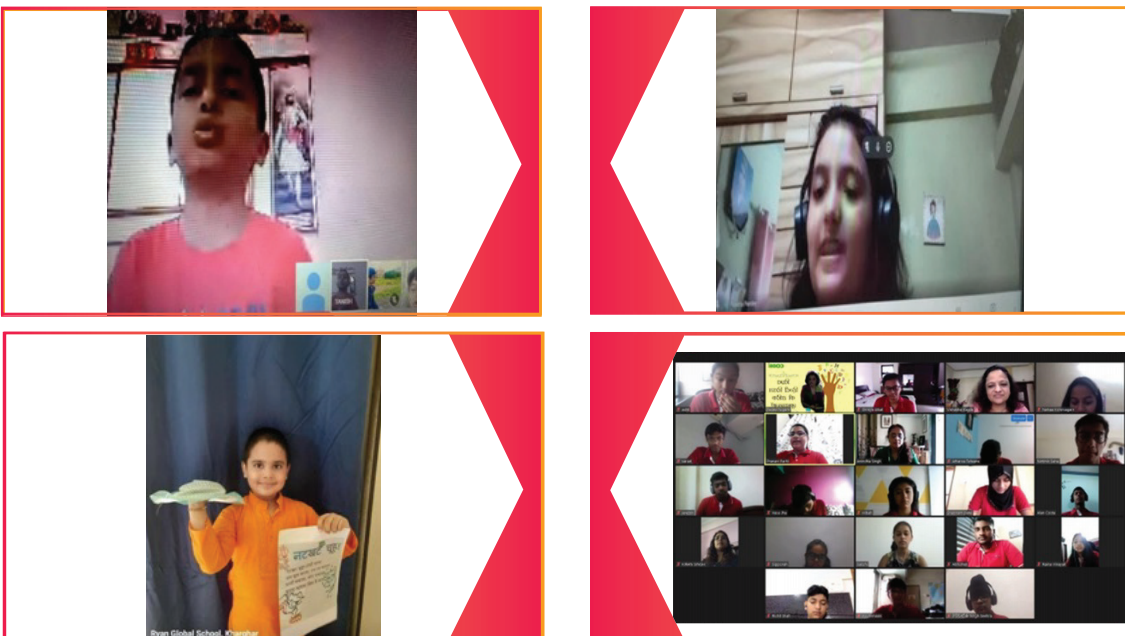
26th August

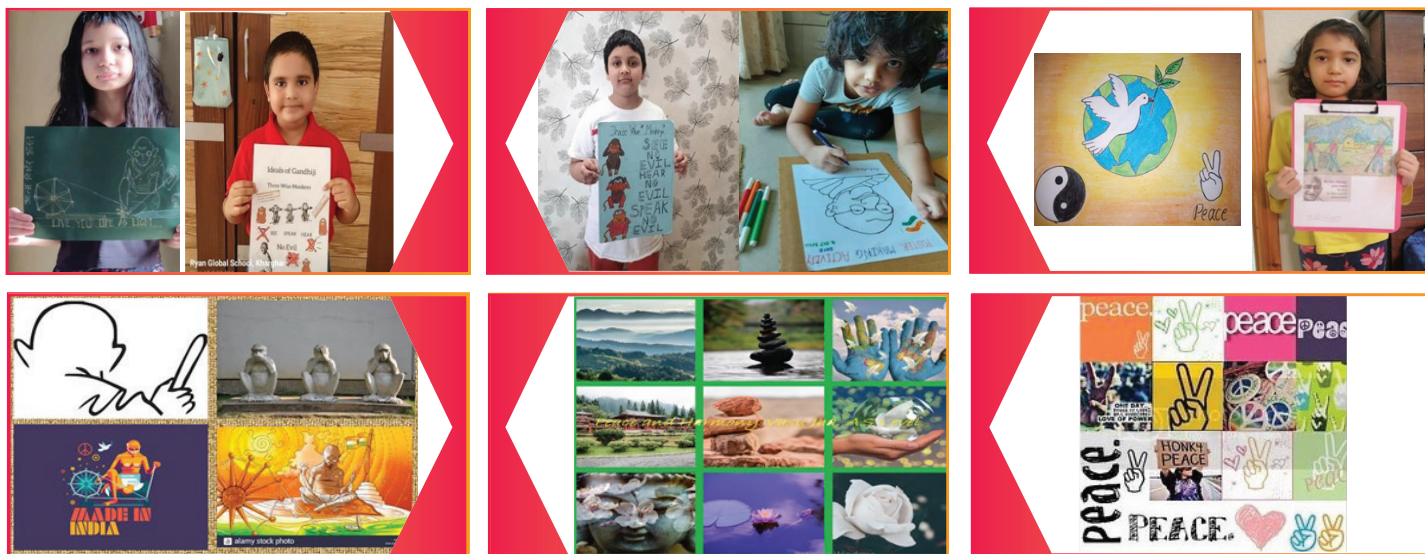

CHILDREN'S DAY SPECIAL ASSEMBLY 2020

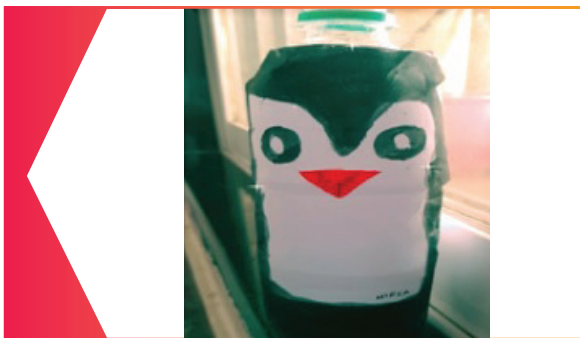
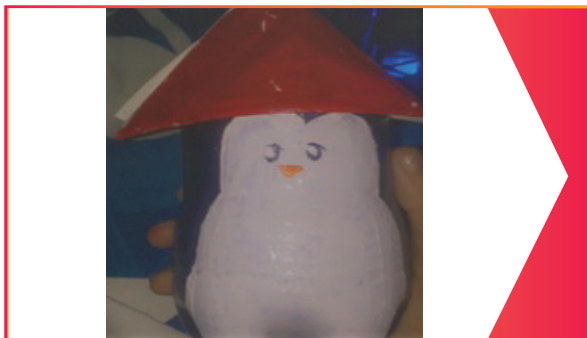

PENGUIN MAKING ACTIVITY

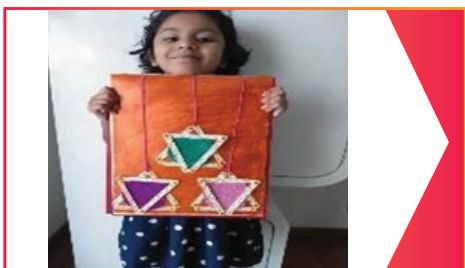
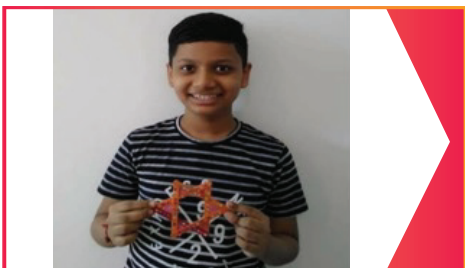
4th Dec

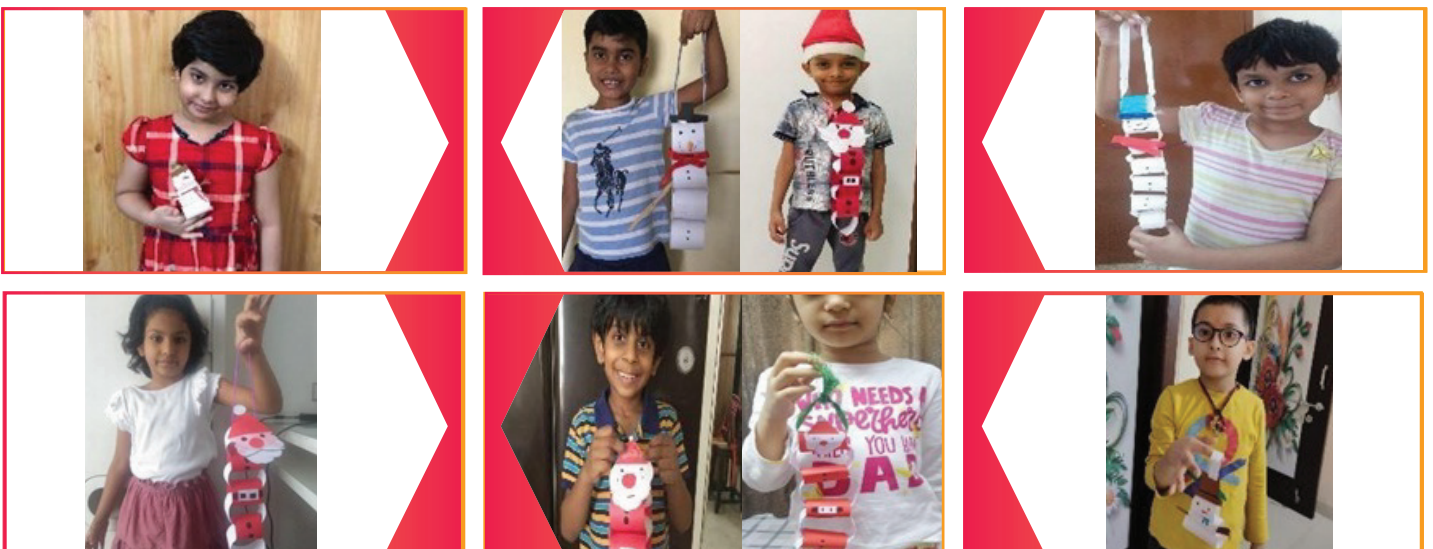
CAROL SINGING COMPETITION

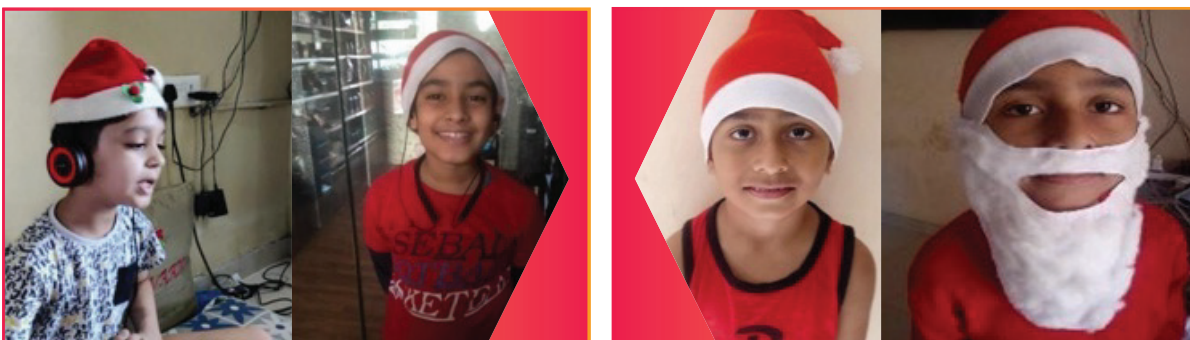
CHRISTMAS TREE MAKING (Gr. III & IV)

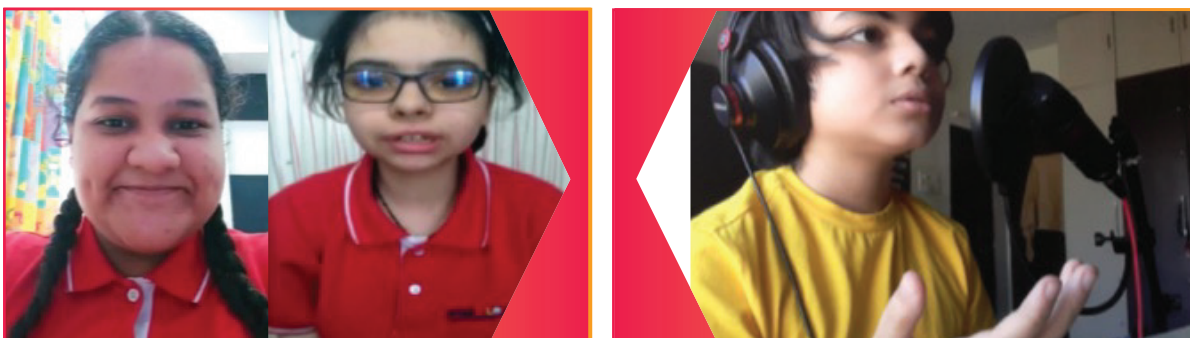
CHRISTMAS CARD MAKING

STORY NARRATION

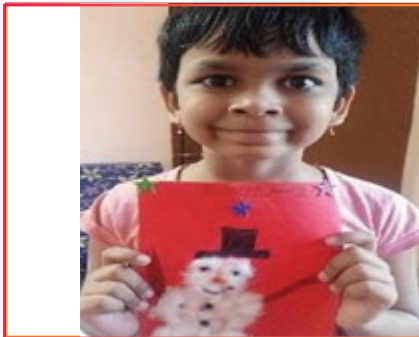

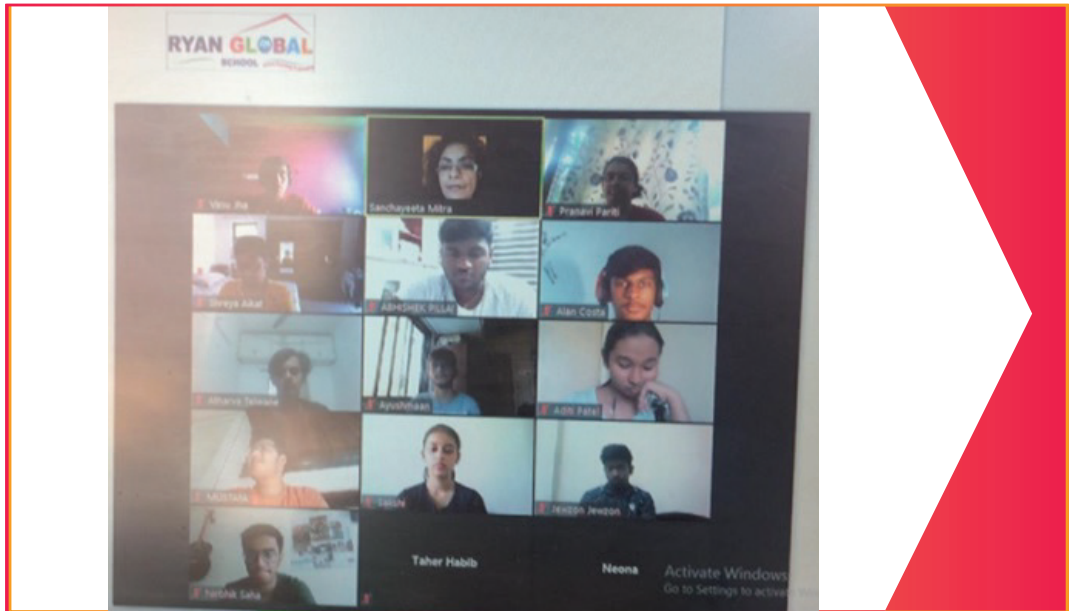

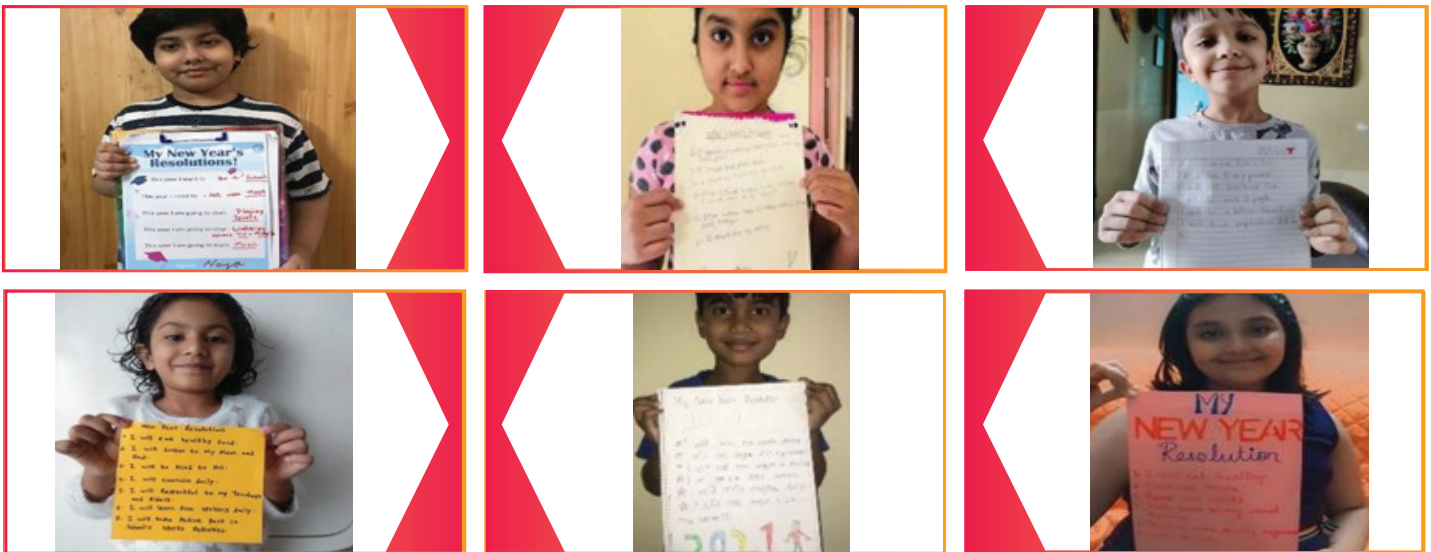
ONE POSITIVE CHANGE

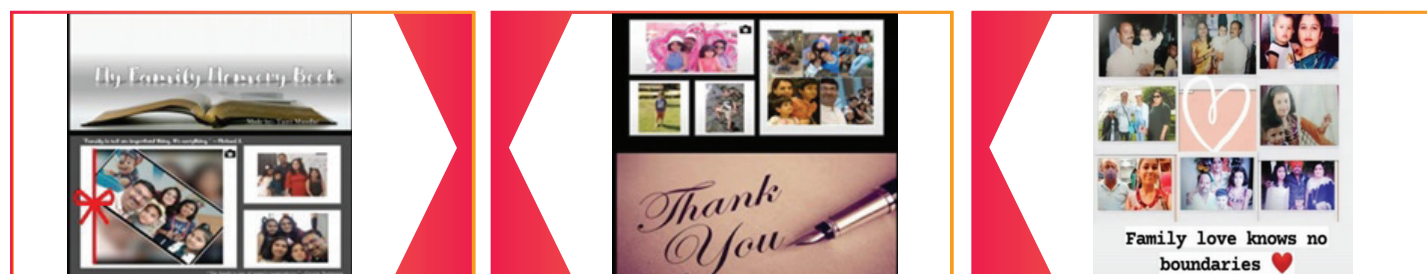
GREETING CARD MAKING ACTIVITY

GLOBAL FAMILY DAY CELEBRATION

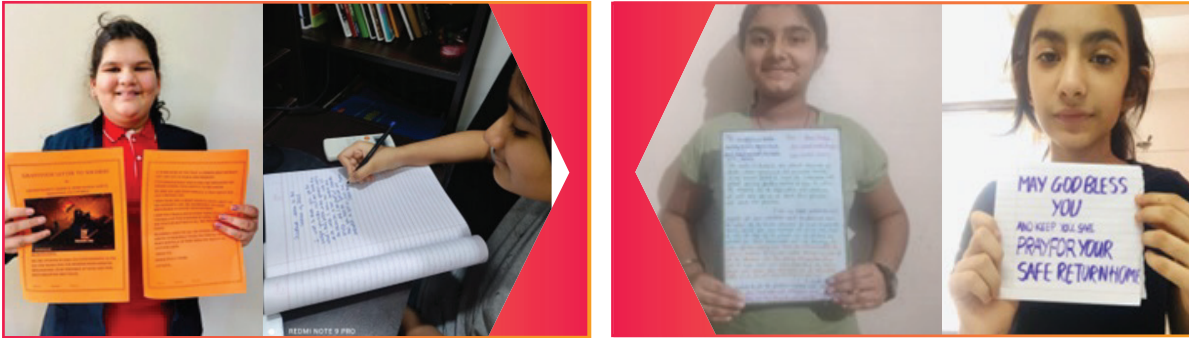

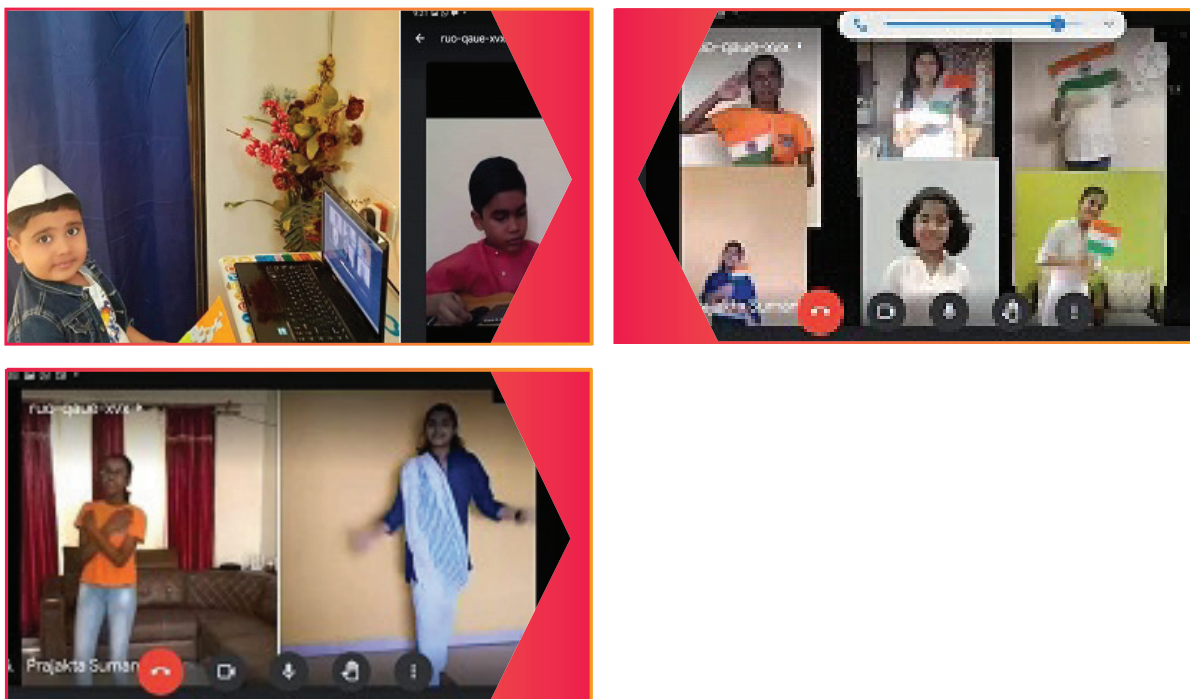
SPRAY PAINTING ACTIVITY

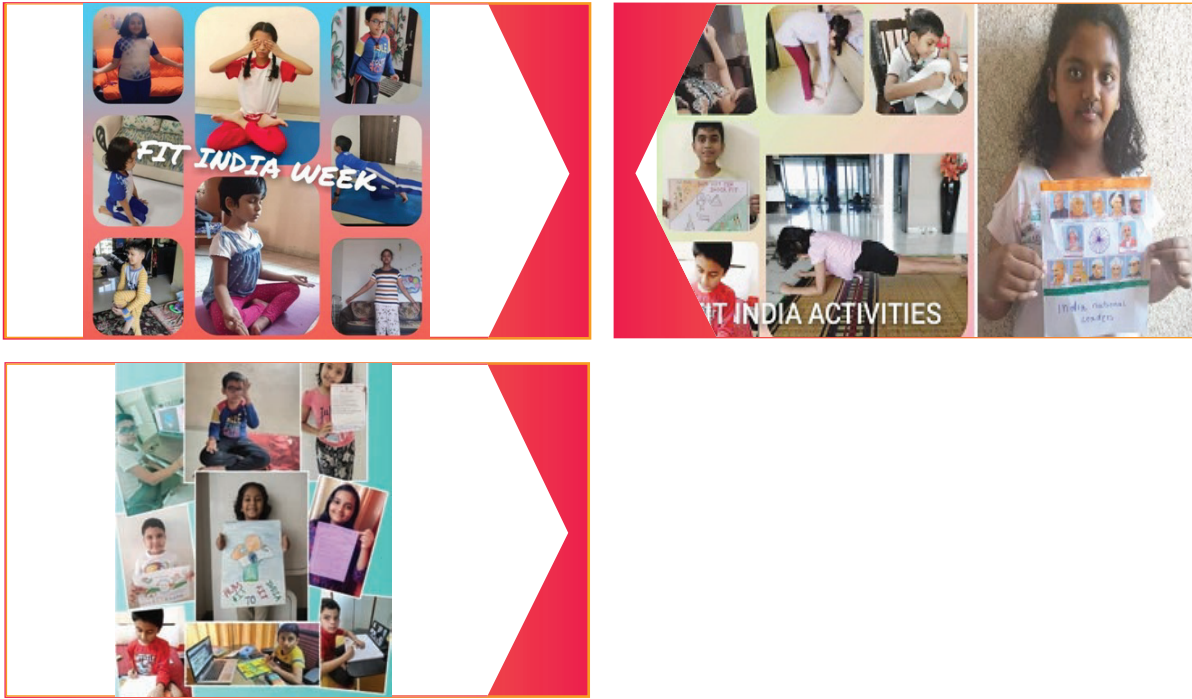
REPUBLIC DAY SPECIAL ASSEMBLY

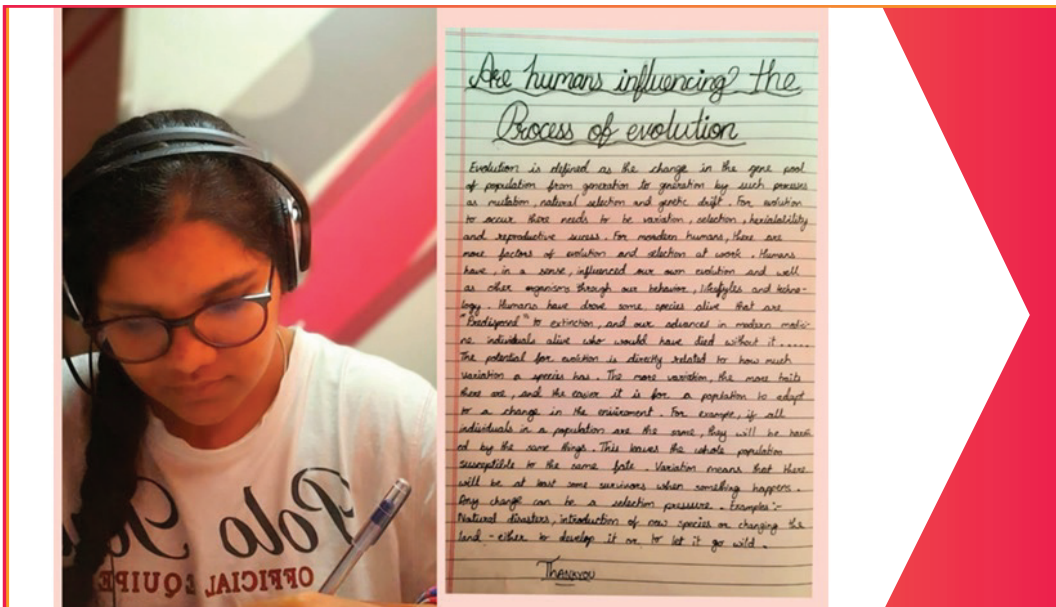
FIT INDIA WEEK (25 TH -29 TH)

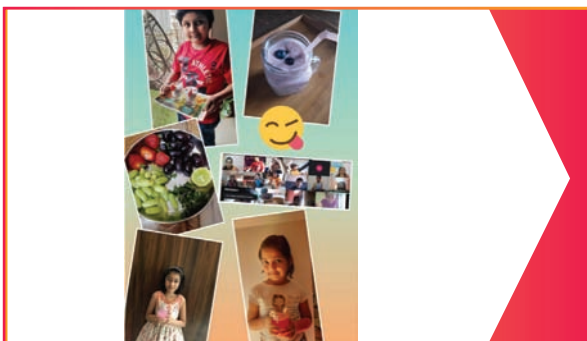
BOUQUET AND CARD MAKING ACTIVITY

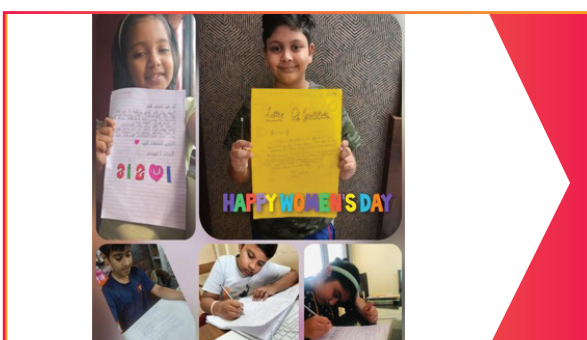
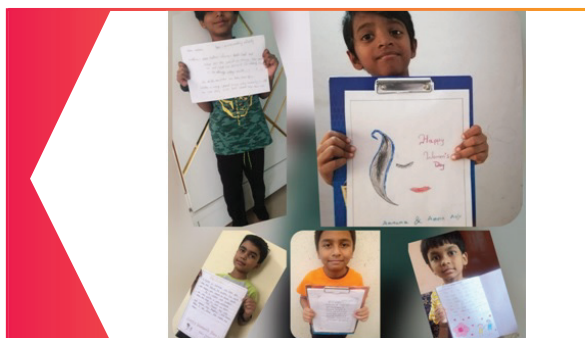
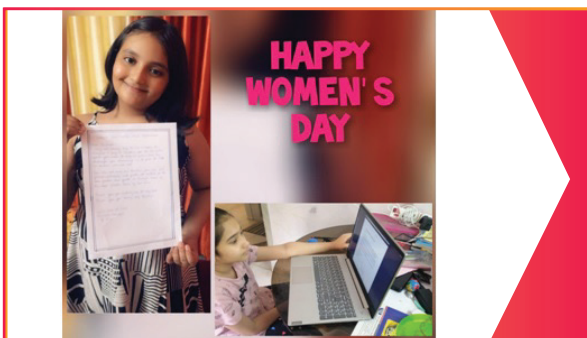
HEALTH DRINK MAKING ACTIVITY
