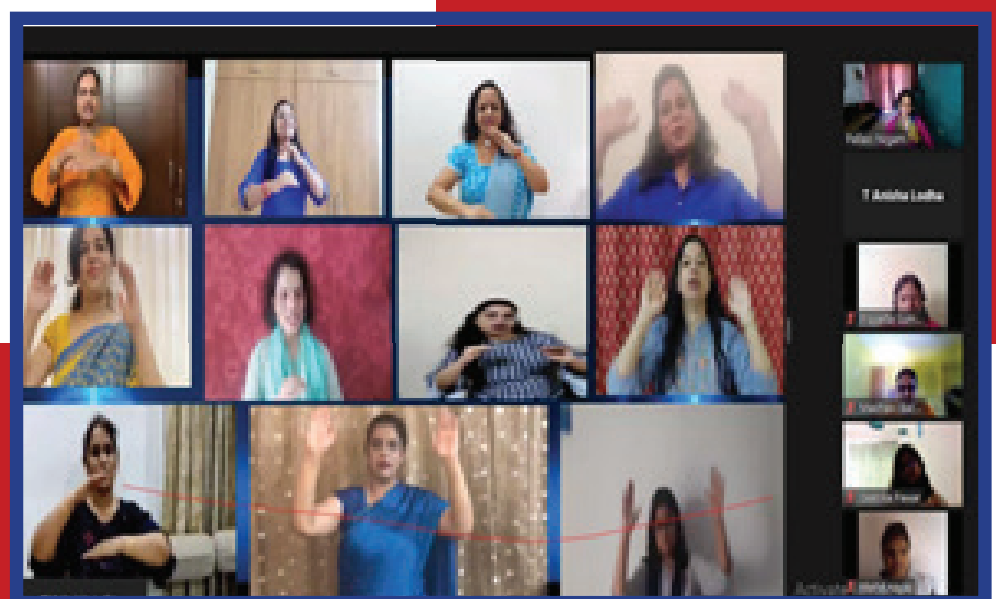
EVENTS & HAPPNING

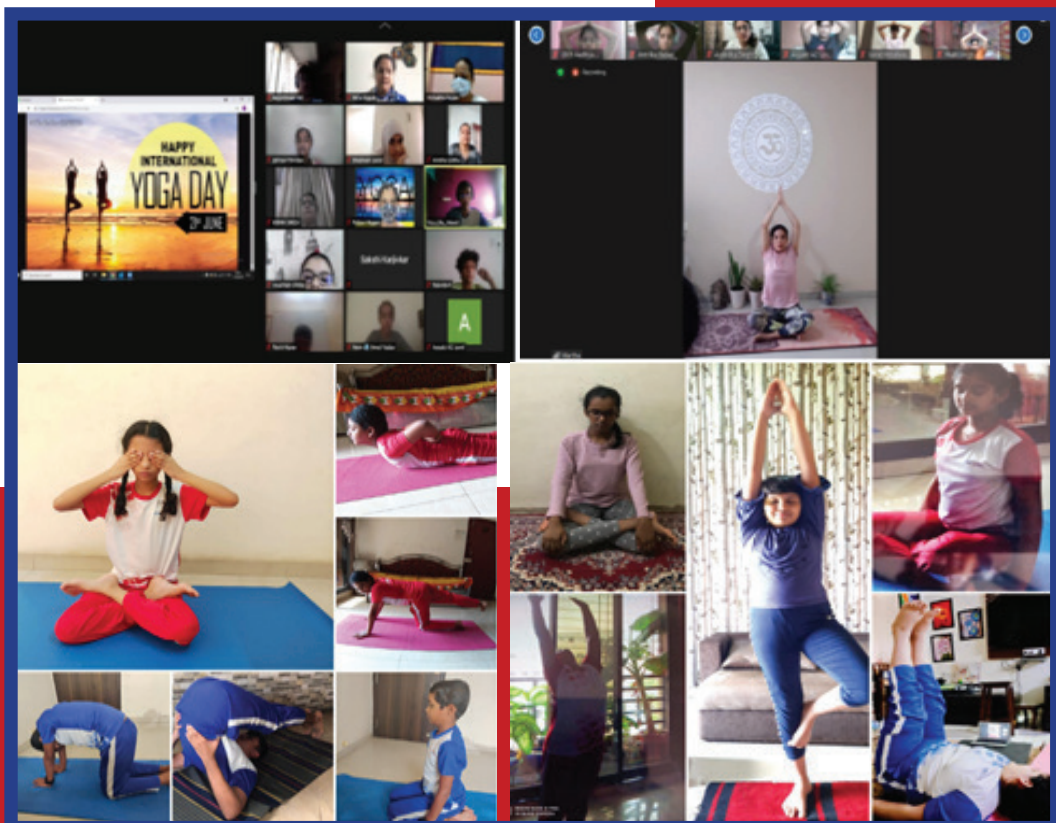


INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY

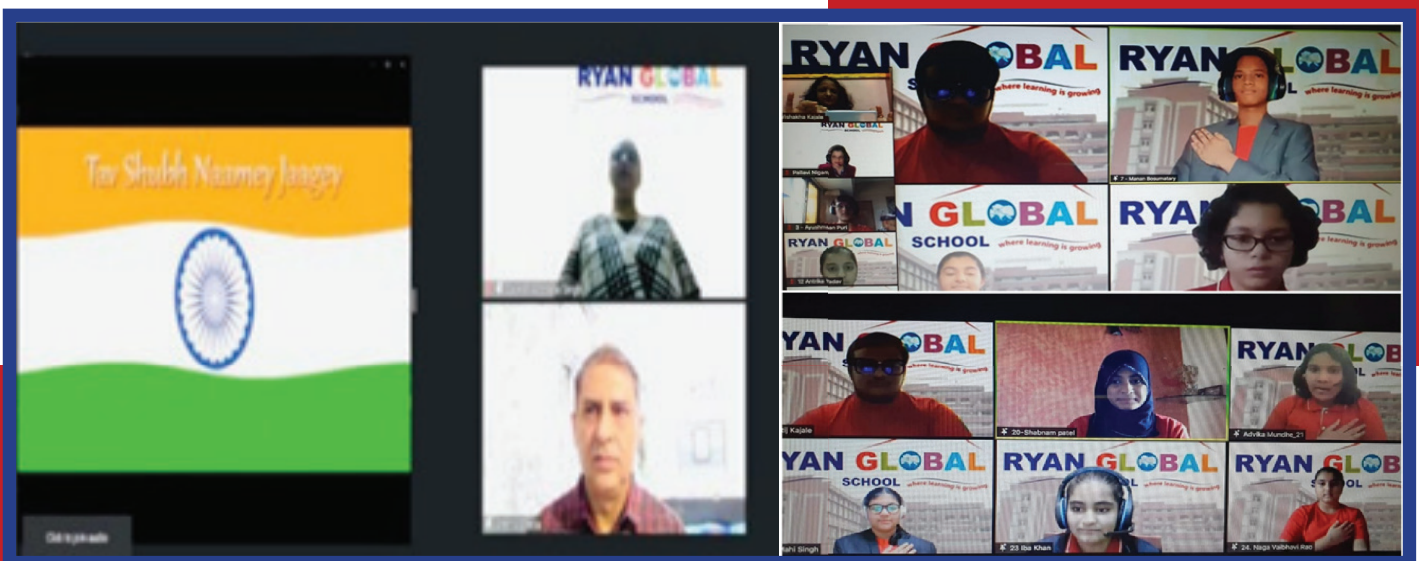
INVESTITURES CEREMONY



Date 10th July 2021

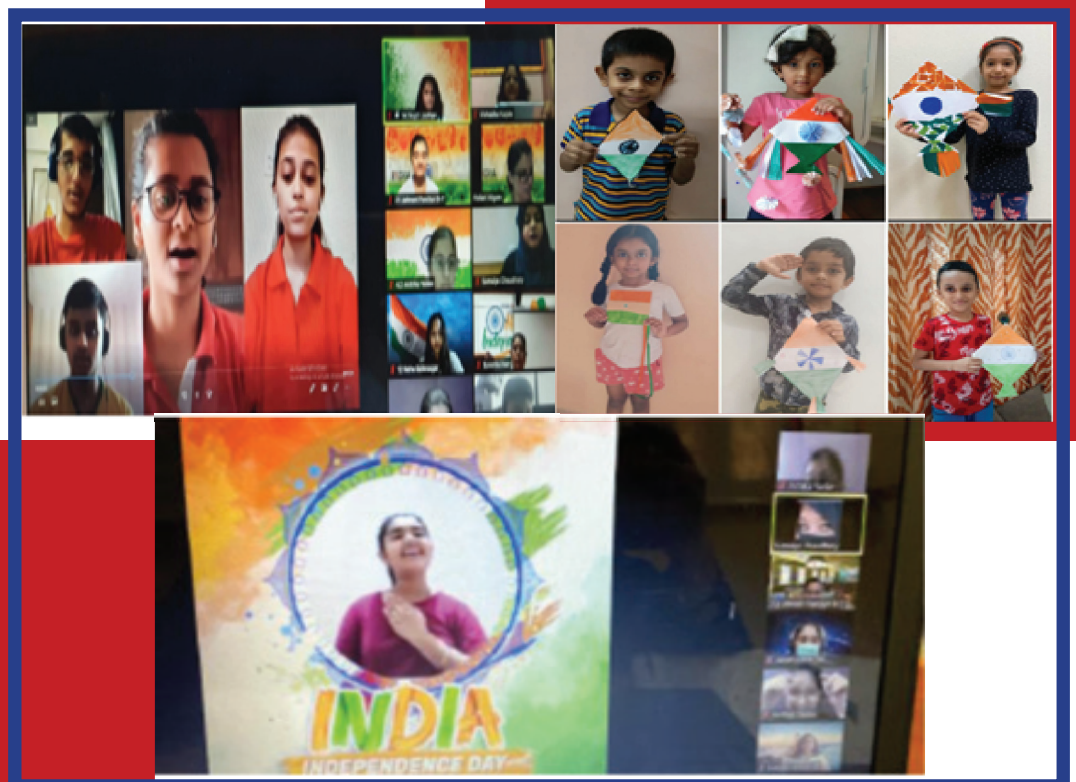

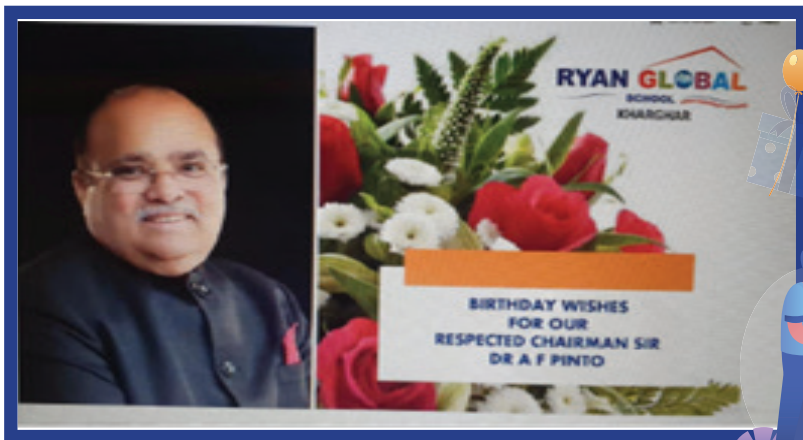

6 September 2021

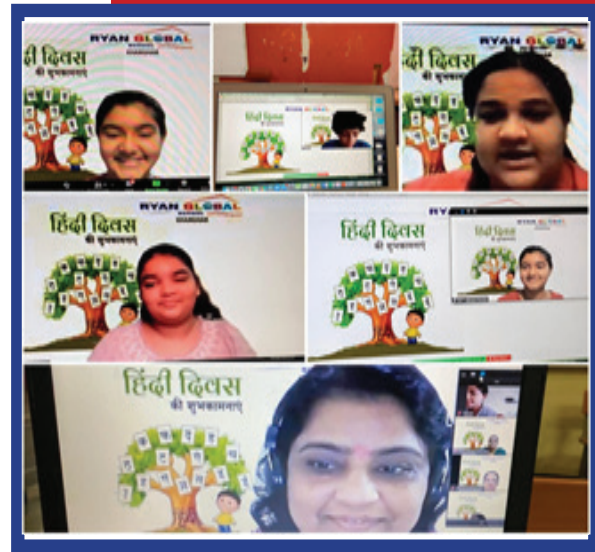
“Education is the key to success in life, and teachers make a lasting impact in the lives of their students.”

HINDI DIWAS ACTIVITY



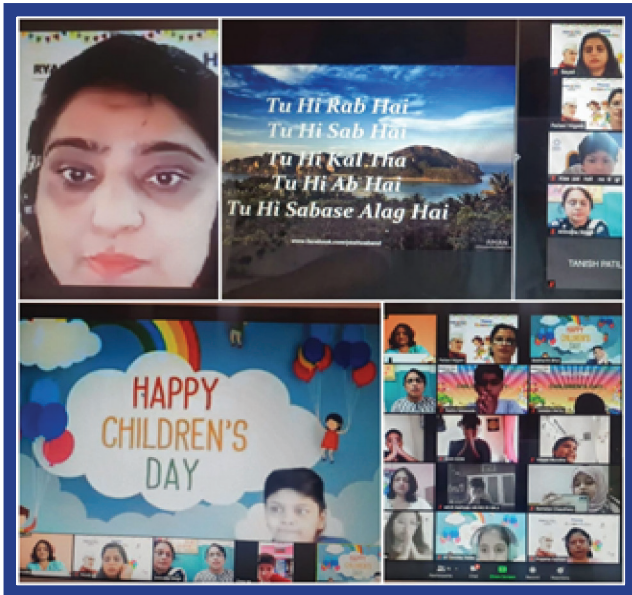
15th September 2021

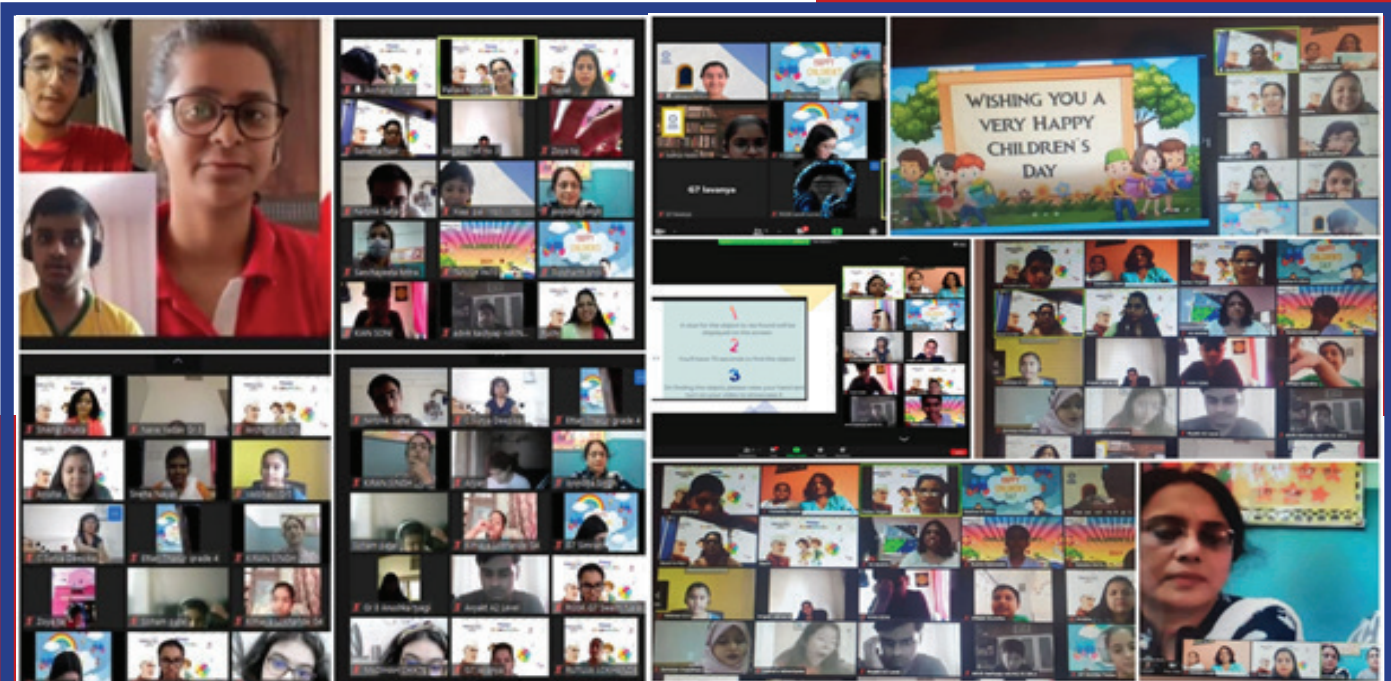
CHILDREN'S DAY

REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATION AND ACTIVITY

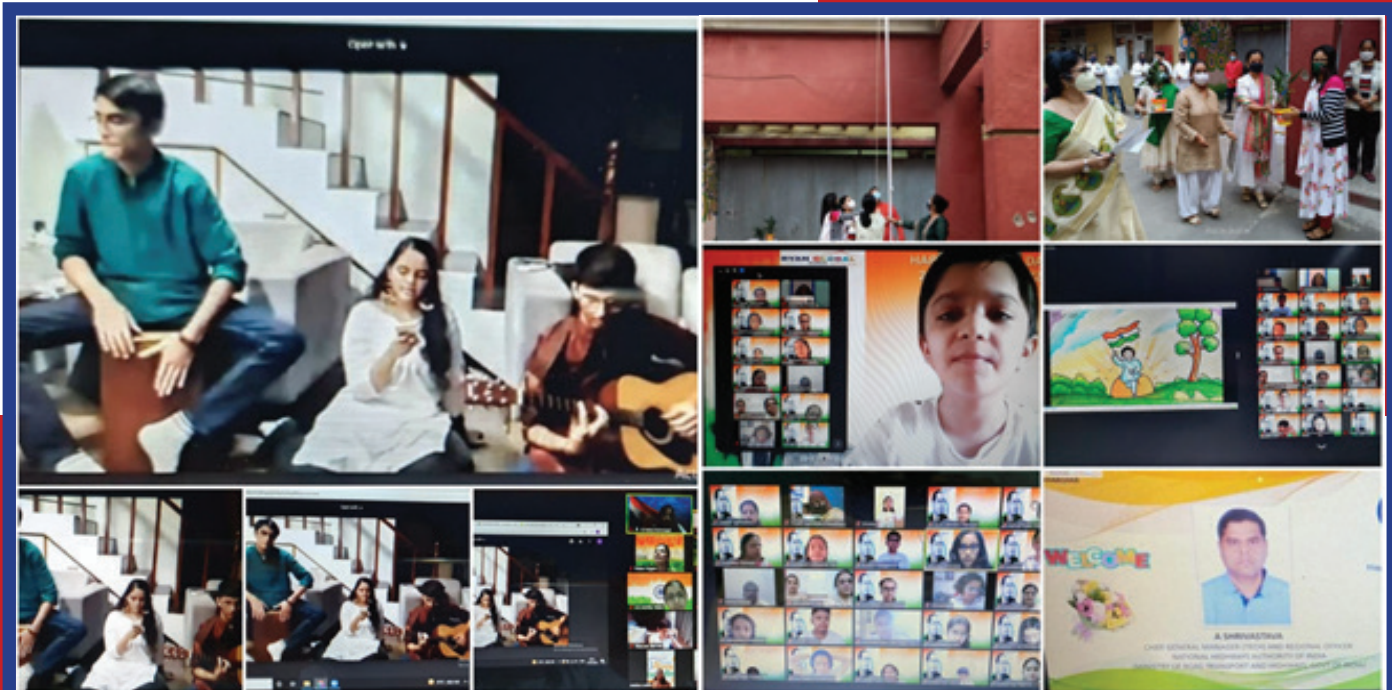


Date - 26th January 2022

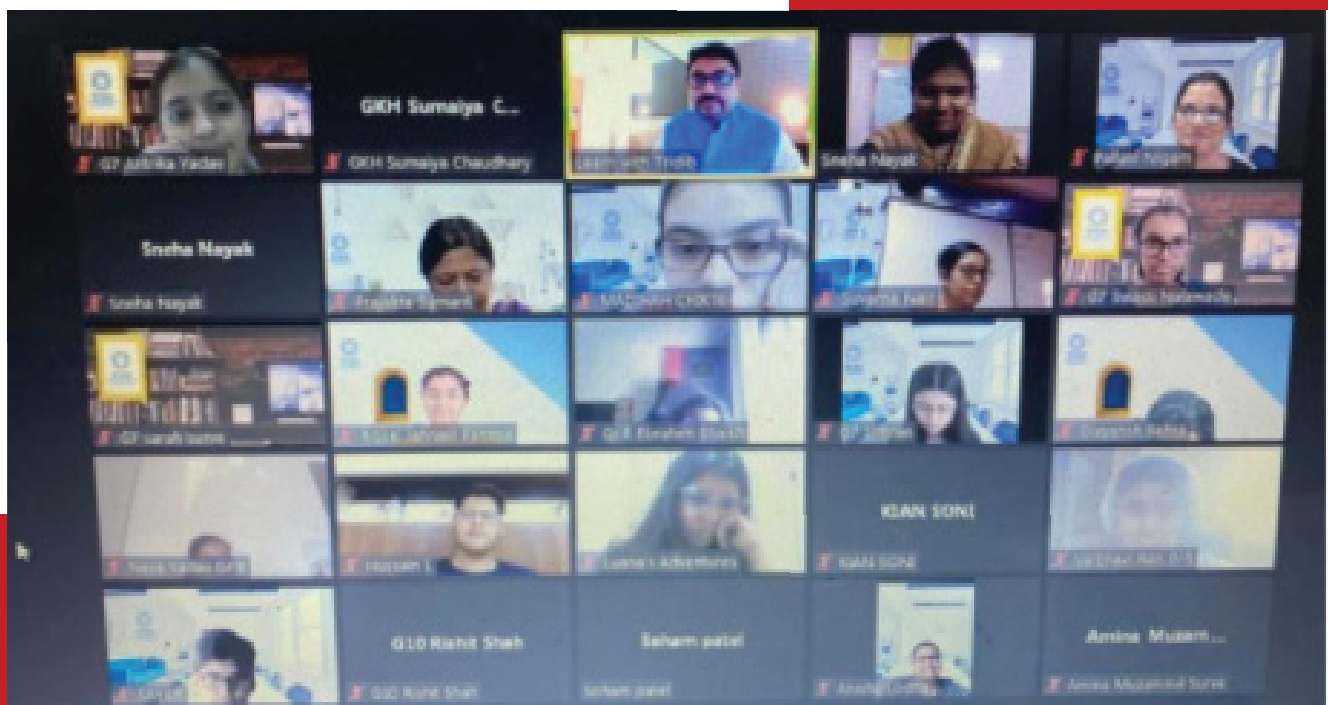
NATIONAL SCIENCE DAY EXHIBITION

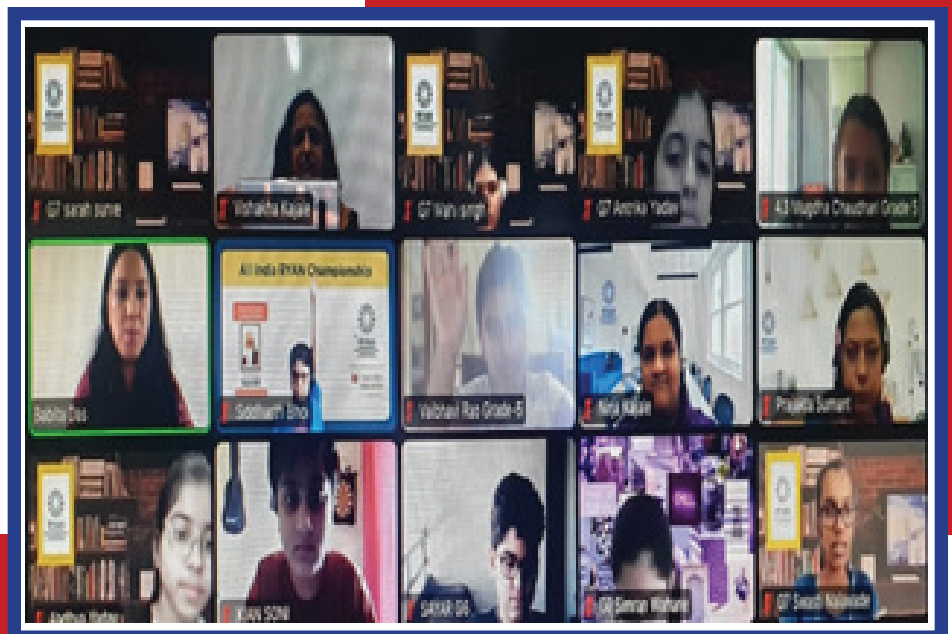




INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH AN ENGINEER

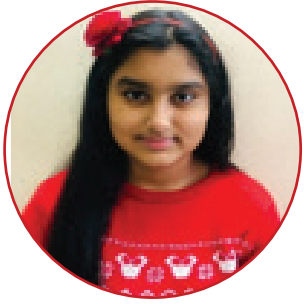

WORLD'S FIERIEST SPY – VIRGINIA HALL

The female fieriest spy in the World War II. But who is she? What is about her that makes her different? Virginia Hall was born in Baltimore on April 6, 1906. Her father, Edwin Lee Hall was an entrepreneur who helped run banks and movie theaters in the city. Her brother Barba was hired as Virginia's father's security. Virginia had a brother named John. Barba made sure Virginia received the best education at All-Girls Academy. Virginia was studying languages at her prep school; she told everyone that she dreamed of becoming a diplomat.

After graduating from high school, Virginia studied at some of the most prestigious universities in the country. She followed her dreams of becoming a diplomat. She transferred to a university in Paris called Ecole Libre Des Sciences Politiques. 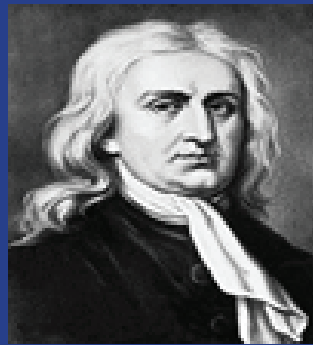

FACT:WORLD'S LARGEST AIRCRAFT

Hi friends, do you know about the world's largest plane? The world's largest plane was the Antonov AN-225 popularly known as “The Dream”. Unfortunately it was destroyed during the Russian invasion of Ukraine, generating alarm and sadness among the aviation world.

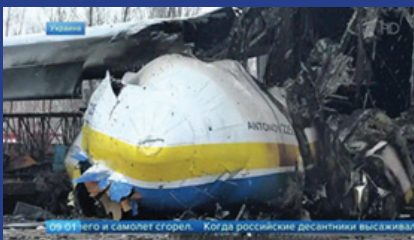
Description

The Antonov An-225 Mriya (translates to ‘Dream’ in Russian) was a strategic airlift cargo aircraft designed in the 1980s by the Antonov Design Bureau in Soviet Ukraine. After successfully fulfilling its military missions, the aircraft was mothballed (A graveyard for aircrafts that are retired from their service) for eight years.

It was then refurbished and reintroduced into commercial operation with Antonov Airlines, carrying oversized payloads. With a maximum take-off weight of 640 tonnes, the An-225 held several records, including ‘heaviest aircraft ever built’ and ‘largest wingspan of any aircraft in operational service’. The Mriya attracted a high degree of public interest, attaining a global following due to its size and its uniqueness. People frequently visited airports to see its scheduled arrivals and departures.

World Records

- The airlifter holds the absolute world record for an airlifted single-item payload of 189,980 kg, and an airlifted total payload of 253,820 kg.
- On 11 September 2001, carrying four main battle tanks at a record load of 253.82 tonnes of cargo, the An-225 flew at an altitude of up to 10,750 m (35,270 ft) over a closed circuit of 1,000 km at a speed of 763.2 km/h.
- On 11 August 2009, the heaviest single cargo item ever sent by air freight was loaded onto the An-225. At 16.23 m (53 ft 3 in) long and 4.27 m (14 ft 0 in) wide, its consignment, a generator for a gas power plant in Armenia along with its loading frame, weighed in at a record 189 tonnes.
- On 11 June 2010, the An-225 carried the world's longest piece of air cargo, two 42.1 m (138 ft) test wind turbine blades from Tianjin, China, to Skrydstrup, Denmark.



Destruction

At the outbreak of the 2022 Russian invasion of Ukraine, the airplane was destroyed during the Battle of Antonov Airport. The ‘dream’ appears to have been shattered with its nose, wings, and some of its engines badly damaged.

JAMES BOND - THE SAVIOR

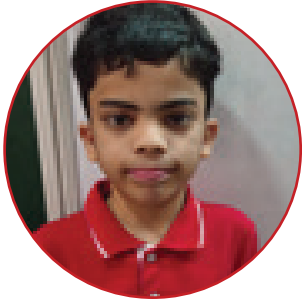

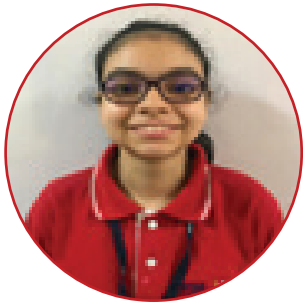

INDIAN SCIENTISTS

Indian Scientist who changed the world and you probably don't know about them. **Prafulla Chandr Ray:** was a Bengal chemist who set up the first chemical factory in India, which later became the Bengal Chemical and Pharmaceutical works Ltd.

Known as "Father of Indian Chemistry", Prafulla Chandra Ray was a well-known Indian scientist and teacher and one of the first "modern" Indian chemical researchers. One of the very notable contributions of Prafulla Chandra in the field of nitrite chemistry was the synthesis of ammonium nitrite in pure form via double displacement between ammonium chloride and silver nitrite, (2). O. Prafulla Chandra established that this reaction is far less facile than thought. Famous Indian scientists Meghnad Saha and Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar were among his students.

Har Gobind Khorana: was Indian-American biochemist who won Nobel Prize in 1968 for demonstrating how the nucleotides in nucleic acids control the synthesis of proteins. In 1970, Khorana became the first to synthesize an artificial gene in a living cell. His work became the foundation for much of the later research in biotechnology and gene therapy.

Chintamani Nagesha Ramachandra Rao: is an Indian chemist who has worked mainly in solid state and structural chemistry. His passion is nanotechnology, especially nanomaterials consisting of carbon molecules. Rao was one of the earliest to synthesize two-dimensional oxide materials such as La_2CuO_4 . He was one of the first to synthesize 123 cuprate, the first liquid nitrogen-temperature superconductor in 1987. He was also the first to synthesize Y junction carbon nanotubes in the mid 1990s.

Sálim Moizuddin Abdul Ali, was an ornithologist and a naturalist. Salim Ali was among the first Indians to conduct systematic bird surveys across India and his bird books helped develop ornithology in the sub-continent. This Birdman of India was the key figure behind the Bombay Natural History Society after 1947 and used his personal influence to garner government support for the organization. He was awarded India's second highest civilian honor, the Padma Vibhushan in 1976.

Acharya J.C. Bose: he was a polymath, physicist, biologist, botanist and archaeologist. He pioneered the study of radio and microwave optics, made important contributions to the study of plants and laid the foundation of experimental science in the Indian sub-continent. He was the first person to use semiconductor junctions to detect radio signals, thus demonstrating wireless communication for the first time. What's more, he is also probably the father of open technology, as he made his inventions and work freely available for others to further develop. His reluctance to patent his work is legendary.

Srinivasa Ramanujan: (need no introduction) was an Indian mathematician. His contributions stretch across mathematics fields, including complex analysis, number theory, infinite series, and continued fractions. Ramanujan's other notable contributions include hyper geometric series, the Riemann series, the elliptic integrals, the theory of divergent series, and the functional equations of the zeta function.

For many developed and developing countries, tourism is a significant source of employment, government revenue, and foreign exchange profits. Many countries may witness a steep decline in GDP and a rise in unemployment if this vital connection is severed.

In the short term, protecting individuals and maintaining a flourishing tourism industry are both vital. With proper social protection, the worst impacts of any type of shock, including the COVID-19 pandemic, can usually be averted. Recently, following a drop in the number of cases and high vaccination numbers, these sectors were witnessing the green shoots of recovery. The impact on the tourism industry extends beyond canceled flights and hotel reservations. There is a compelling case to be made for governments to intervene and collaborate on a global scale to protect lives and livelihoods. To conclude, the COVID-19 pandemic will undoubtedly leave a deep imprint on the structure of the travel and tourism industry. Consequently, the travel and tourism sector that will emerge from the pandemic is likely to be smaller, in terms of both employment and revenue, than it was before.
