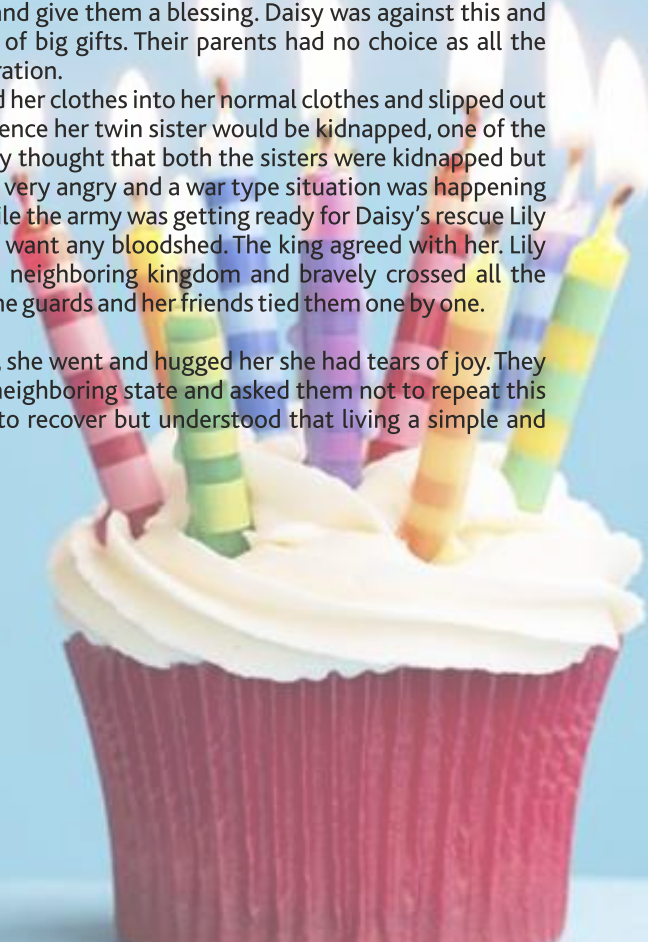

FOOTBALLER NEYMAR JR.

Neymar da Silva Santos Júnior, born on 5 February 1992, is a Brazilian professional footballer who plays as a forward for French club Paris Saint-Germain and the Brazil national team. He is also known as Neymar Jr. or Neymar. Neymar gained attention at an early age of 17 when he professionally debuted for Santos FC. He helped the club win two successive Brazilian club championships, one Copa do Brasil, and the 2011 Copa Libertadores. Neymar was twice named the South American Footballer of the Year, in 2011 and 2012, before moving to Europe to join Barcelona. He created a very good chemistry with his teammates Lionel Messi and Luis Suárez, they were also known as MSN. With this deadly trio he went on to win the continental treble of La Liga, the Copa del Rey, and the UEFA Champions League, and came third for the FIFA Ballon d'Or in 2015. In August 2017 he was transferred from FC Barcelona to Paris Saint-Germain in a deal worth 222 million, making him the world's most expensive player. In 2017, he was also voted as the league's best player.

He debuted for his national team Brazil at the age of 18 where he scored 59 goals in 92 matches from which he became the third highest goalscorer for his national team, trailing only Pelé and Ronaldo. He was a key player in Brazil's victories at the 2011 South American Youth Championship, where he finished as leading goalscorer, and the 2013 FIFA Confederations Cup, where he won the Golden Ball as player of the tournament. He captained Brazil to their first Olympic gold medal in men's football at the 2016 Summer Olympics, and two years later, featured at the 2018 FIFA World Cup.

Kylian Mbappé Lottin was born on 20 December 1998. His idol was Cristiano Ronaldo, a player he looked to emulate however, his playing style is very similar to Thierry Henry. He is a French professional footballer who plays as a forward for League 1 club Paris Saint-Germain and the France national team. At the age of 19, he has been labelled the best young player in the world, and has been projected as the future best player in the world.

Mbappé came into prominence at an early age, starring for the youth academy at Bondy before gaining a move to Monaco, where he made his professional debut in 2015, aged 16. Mbappé then quickly established himself as a regular goalscorer for the first team in the 2016–17 season, as he helped the club get their first Ligue 1 title in seventeen years. A year later, he transferred to Paris Saint-Germain for 180 million, making him the most expensive teenager.

In 2017–2018 he was loaned to PSG from AS Monaco after a devastating performance. He was given the 29 number shirt. He scored his debut goal for PSG on 8 September against FC Metz. In the next season he was handed over the number 7 shirt which was vacant after the transfer of Lucas Moura. He made his national team debut in 2016 and won the U19 UEFA European Championship for France. In 2018 he won the FIFA World Cup which was held in Russia. They played the final against Croatia, the score was 4-2 and Mbappe scored one goal and became the FIFA World Cup Best Young Player Award. Recently he was included in the dream XI by FIFA.
